Welcome and introductions

Kari Hartel and Scott Jackson Co-Chairs of the Planning Council welcomed guests and Planning Council members to the meeting. The Planning Council and community members introduced themselves.

Keynote Speaker Dr. Judy Zerzan

Keynote Speaker and Chief Medical Officer/Deputy Medical Director of the Colorado Department of Health Care Policy and Financing Dr. Judy Zerzan was introduced. She presented *Medicaid Expansion – Accountable Care Collaborative* and facilitated a Q and A session afterward.

In her presentation Dr. Zerzan reviewed the mission of the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing (HCPF's) role within healthcare, its service population and eligibility requirements for Medicaid and CHP+ based on annual income. She also provided an overview of HCPF's Strategic Plan, an understanding of the ACC Program, the ACC Program Vision and ACC Component (including responsibilities of RCCO, PCPs, SDAC and the ACC.) The ACC Process involving Primary Care Providers, a Statewide Data Analytics Contractor and Regional Care Collaborative Organizations was explained, along with the ACC's Advisory Committees, Benefits of the ACC and Initial Results.

The meeting then broke for lunch.

Speaker Bob Bongiovanni

Bob Bongiovanni, Manager of the HIV Care and Treatment Program at the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE) reviewed the seven goals and objectives making up the recommendations for HIV Health Care Reform. Populations of significance included people and communities of color, men who have sex with men, people who inject street drugs, individuals who trade sex for something needed, people living in poverty, transgender people, those who are currently or formerly incarcerated, and people living with mental health and substance use concerns.

Speaker Maria Lopez

Maria Lopez provided an overview of the Planning Council's 2012-2014 Comprehensive Plan, including its purpose and planning process.

The group then broke for a second time for a working lunch.

Brainstorm Session

The assembly held a brainstorm session in order to discuss together the future of the DHRPC Focus.

- HIV care and Medical Home how can we transition? How do we remain viable?
- Group to spread knowledge for HCPF.
- What is Medical Home- What are things RW Clinics do?

- Data- for those referred? How do we follow RW Clients into a separate system? Can we have access to data once participants are transitioned?
- Collaboration.
- Principle of Community Engagement – MDASC
- More than a Community Advisory Board
- Does RW Care provide Better Health outcomes? Let’s look at our data and compare to Health Care Policy and Finance. Important to look at Viral Loads in our current system of care.
- Payor of last resort.
- Provider/ Institution restrictions
- Insurance
- Co-Location of Medical Case Management

Next Steps

DHRPC and Part A to collaborate with Part B to develop an ACA outline/workplan.

- The workplan will clearly state goals and outcomes
- Targets and focuses resources to achieve desired outcomes
- Sets a systematic plan to include data, advocacy and collaboration.
 - Example of key focus areas from retreat: Members to attend key HCPF meetings, workgroups to advocate for high quality HIV care
 - Develop collaborations with Regional Care Collaborative Organizations.
